In the event that a Pembroke were to be considered for adoption by you, there will be written, binding agreements between you and the Rescue Committee/Club. In the written agreement, among other things, you would make certain agreements regarding your care of the Pembroke. You would agree that the Pembroke would be returned to the Rescue Committee/Club if you do not abide by the agreements or if you could no longer care for the Pembroke.

Also, please understand that while the Rescue Committee/Club will have had the Pembroke examined by a veterinarian, the Rescue Committee/Club cannot make any guarantees regarding the health or physical condition of the Pembroke. Understand too that all expenses after the adoption (including medical expenses) relating to the Pembroke will be your responsibility.

The Pembroke will be spayed/neutered before you adopt it. Prior to your adoption, there will be a \$250.00 donation (or higher if you would like to give more) from you to the Rescue Committee/Club to defray expenses related to rescue efforts.

The Rescue Committee/Club would appreciate that, after you complete this application and are waiting for a Pembroke, you notify the Chairman if you get another dog and/or if you decide that you no longer wish to adopt a Pembroke.
